 - How this educational experience will enhance your future goals and plans in community/public health.
 - How you have demonstrated excellence in performance and shown leadership ability in your profession/vocation.
 - What do you think are the most important public health issues or challenges in your area?
 - Other relevant information that you think the review committee should know about you in making their decision.
